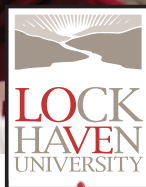


Earn College Credit While You Study at FLS Lock Haven!



The Haven

Located in an all-American small town in the heart of Pennsylvania, Lock Haven University offers a range of excellent undergraduate programs in the humanities, arts and sciences. Now, FLS students can earn college credit with concurrent enrollment at Lock Haven! Choose from dozens of classes across many majors. Get an early start on your studies, experience a real American college class and explore new fields of knowledge!

This program is open to high school graduates who enroll in the FLS General, Intensive or Academic English programs. If you select a Lock Haven University course taught during the day, you may be excused from English classes at FLS.

Since students must complete a full semester of study to earn college credit, this program is recommended for students who plan to enroll for 20 weeks or longer. FLS recommends that students have an English proficiency equal to FLS Level Six to enroll in Lock Haven courses.

Class offerings vary by semester. Please check the class listing box to see sample available courses.

Program Conditions:

- Students must register using the 1-page LHU 'walk-in registration form'.
- Students must register at least 30 days before the semester start date.
- Students must submit a copy of high school transcripts and health forms.
- Students must pay international tuition and fees, approximately \$2,500 for a 3 credit course.
- Students may register for any undergraduate class not requiring a prerequisite.
- Students who complete a class with a passing grade will receive college credit.

Program Dates:

The fall semester starts at the end of August.
The spring semester starts at the end of January.
